



## **Asperula odoratum**

**Common Name:** Sweet Woodruff, Sweet-scented Bedstraw

**Bloom Time:** Late Spring/Early Summer

**Height:** 6-12”

**Exposure:** Shade

**General Information:** The plant contains coumarin that gives it its characteristic smell of freshly mowed grass, that has its full strength only when dried. The dried leaves are popular in potpourris. The leaves are used in some wines and in summer drinks in Europe. Woodruff is also used in perfumes and medicinally.
